As Bishop Paul Erickson of the Greater Milwaukee Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church has recommended, "Many have asked what they can do to be supportive. One simple but powerful gesture would be to send a card or message of support to Betty and/or her husband Carlos at the detention center. Please know that all messages will be opened and read prior to reaching her, but knowing how many people are waiting and watching with her would be very helpful."

It will be forwarded to them at the detention center where they are now being detained. And let us also remember, pray, and seek justice for others who have sought peace and safety in our country. Council Highlights - May 19, 2019

The Council is now working from a Consent Agenda in addition to the meeting agenda. On the regular agenda, Elesa and Cheri shared their positive experiences as representatives to Synod Assembly on May 4-5; Elesa is exploring the possibility for Holy Trinity to get involved with the Blessings in a Backpack program to provide extra food for schoolchildren in need; the idea for a "Blue Mass" honoring first responders on June 23 was approved; the Mission Statement currently on our web site, holytrinitymarshall.com, was officially adopted; the need for professional custodial services was discussed; major events such as First Communion and Confirmation Sundays will be held at the late service from now on; nearly two dozen Marshall High School students were here to clean the church and parsonage on their Service Day, May 17; holding our Blessings of the Animals service at a local farm in the fall was discussed and will be explored.
